

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

Nobody does the urban strip mall quite like we Americans do it. I really do believe them to be a unique experience. As ultimate concentrations of convenience, pop culture, and consumerism, they often have an uncanny ability to reflect our society. If you want to know just about anything about a given area and its people, hang around one of its strip malls – they can be a sort of local barometer for all things positive and negative.

I suppose that I've always had a sort of fascination with strip malls; especially those built in once-upcoming areas that are now forgotten, irrelevant, and often a bit dilapidated. Far from examples of architectural distinction, they're usually monotonous and unspectacular in their design; yet they seem to stand still in time as ever-expanding suburbs and pop culture pass them by without the slightest hint of mercy. Some now even find themselves part of a "bad part of town;" and, bereft of actual customers, their respective establishments struggle and are sometimes forced to specialize in discounted or exceptionally specific or odd merchandise.

However, despite all of this, and as many of us pass by these places everyday, there are still interesting people doing interesting things to be found. Some of these people and things are good and some are – well – bad. From this point of view is where I think *Two Hundred Thousand Dirty* and its characters can trace their roots. That and my own personal experiences in terrible, low-end, mind-numbing retail jobs to which I am hopeful many people can relate.

Mark Greenfield is a New York based actor, writer, and director. His recent film credits include Amir Naderi's *Vegas: Based on a True Story*, which premiered in Competition at the 2008 Venice Film Festival and the 2009 Tribeca Film Festival. On stage he has appeared with companies that include Gorilla Rep, IMAGO and the Italian Commedia dell'Arte company I Giullari Di Piazza.

As a writer, Mark's original stage play "*I.E. – In Other Words*" was produced by New York City's Flea Theater, and he was also an on-set writer for the feature film *Whip It* which marked Drew Barrymore's directorial debut. Mark is also the founding director of the Faux-Real Theatre Company with whom he has created and directed works that include *FUNBOX*, *William Shakespeare's Haunted House*, *Htebcam (Macbeth in Reverse)*, and most recently *All-Male Oedipus Rex & All-Female Seven Against Thebes* (both of which were presented at NYC SummerStage 2011). Mark currently teaches theatre at Fordham University.



COOLIO

as MANNY

Coolio is originally from the Compton area of Los Angeles, California and is one of hip-hop's foremost pioneers and best-selling artists of all-time. Upon releasing his Platinum debut album *It Takes a Thief* in 1994, his career success would continue to skyrocket with the release of 1995's "*Gangsta's Paradise*". Originally written for the soundtrack of the film *Dangerous Minds*, the single would become the #1 international single of 1995, the title track of his second album, earn Coolio a Grammy, top the Billboard Top 100 charts, and eventually go certified Triple Platinum.

Coolio followed with several hit singles and albums to date and is still creating new music and touring all over the world. In addition to his music career, Coolio is a cuisine aficionado and has acted or appeared in dozens of films and television productions around the world, including his own television programs *Coolio's Rules* and *Cookin' with Coolio* (for which he released a subsequent cookbook).



ROCÍO VERDEJO

as ISABELLE

Rocío Verdejo is an actress and mother of two originally from Tampico, Mexico. She has appeared in numerous feature films including the highly successful dark action film *Matando Cabos*, which had its US Premiere at the 2005 Sundance Film Festival. Among many others, she has recently appeared in such films as *Vantage Point*, *Tear This Heart Out*, *Desafío*, and most recently *Ella y el Candidato*. Rocío currently lives and works in Mexico City. *Two Hundred Thousand Dirty* is her first leading role in an American film.

C. Clayton Blackwell is a Wyoming native. He received his B.A. in Theatre with an emphasis in Acting for the Camera at the University of Nevada – Las Vegas. His Las Vegas show credits include *Star Trek: The Experience* and *Tony n' Tina's Wedding*. His feature film credits include Kar Wai Wong's *My Blueberry Nights*, which starred Norah Jones, Jude Law, and Natalie Portman and premiered and was nominated for the Palm d'Or at the 2007 Cannes Film Festival. Recently, he portrayed Captain Ahab in Orson Welles' *Moby Dick Rehearsed*, and he is currently a second year M.F.A. Acting Candidate at Northern Illinois University's School of Theatre & Dance. *Two Hundred Thousand Dirty* is his first leading role in a feature film.

Kenneth is a Philadelphia-based actor and director with extensive credits in both film and theater.
